"It is the greatest honour of my career to have been elected President of the British Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons. I hope that I have been able to take on the challenge of providing an inclusive style of leadership and vision to inspire our colleagues for the future."





OMFS is a specialty which has developed from a firm base in trauma and oral cancer management and evolved into multiple specialty and subspecialty areas and we continue to develop expertise with improvements in patient outcomes and care, now measurable with QOMS. Since my time as a trainee, I remember the feeling of "moving goalposts" and jumping numerous hurdles. We must continue to ensure our future surgeons are well supported by working towards more seamless pathways in training.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank BAOMS Council who have worked hard this year. We held a strategy day in November 2023 **the outcomes** of which are now available on the members' area.

Following discussions on the role of Physician Associates we published the BAOMS position on this and similarly we debated the dual degree position and have released the Oxford Declaration. The strategy includes proactive working with our partners to try to ensure the unique training needs of our doctors and dentists are recognised and supported with the primary aim of maintaining current high standards of professionals to ensure best patient care.

It is with great sadness that I report to you the passing of Professor Robert (Bob) Woodwards, Past President of BAOMS. He

was a great leader and a real gentleman, inspiring in his good-humoured support particularly for trainees.

Over the years I have been fortunate to come across so many amazing colleagues, like Bob, from whom I have learnt so much, so many trainees who inspire me with their thirst for knowledge and excellence and so many patients who express gratitude for the positive impact on their lives of what we do. It is also incredibly humbling to hear the stories of complications, errors and the impact of poor communication within teams when care does not match expectations. One of the most difficult things I have had to do was to consent for my son to have spinal surgery, to watch his



suffering post-operatively and to feel that he was so vulnerable when his care did not meet what I felt were basic expectations. His surgeon and physiotherapists were brilliant, the hospital was a well renowned centre of excellence, I had done my homework but there I was with no control over poor post-operative care that I knew should have been handled much better. He has made great progress thankfully but the experience has left emotional scars which will no doubt affect his future care. Naturally I spoke up, but I had no voice... no-one was listening. I always felt I was patient focussed and listened well, but being the other side brought new insights and I wanted to share that learning by bringing our patients' voices to our Annual Scientific Meeting for the first time by having patients on all the panels and involved in discussions.

It gives me great pleasure to invite you all to the BAOMS ASM to be held at the Oxford Mathematical Institute 3-5th July 2024. The theme of the meeting will be "The Patients' Voice". The preliminary programme is live on line.

The format of the meeting will include two main lecture theatres running with panels to include patients throughout the meeting. I have asked surgeons to concentrate on complications and how these have informed their practice. Alongside the main sessions there will be two rooms with free paper presentations, the timings of each event allowing surgeons with subspecialty interests to be able to attend sessions relevant to their practice throughout the 3 days of the meeting. The President's lecture will be given by Liz O'Riordan whose valuable insights into being both patient and surgeon and whose work empowering patients can benefit our own practises. Panel sessions will be interspersed with keynote lectures live streamed to the second main lecture theatre so attendees do not have to move rooms. Ashok Handa will cover values-based care in keeping with the patient centred approach. William Allum will discuss the workforce census specific to OMFS and Helen Higham will discuss understanding how things go right in healthcare, an alternative human factors view. We will hear two speakers from the Centre for Perioperative are, Scarlett McNally and Jugdeep Dhesi, and two speakers on managing gunshot injuries in the US and UK Rui Fernandes and Sat Parmar. Looking to the future Luis Capitan will describe advances in facial feminisation surgery in transgender patients and the Norman Rowe lecture will be delivered by Daniel Borsuk who led the team that carried out the first face transplant in Montreal. This prestigious lecture will be followed by presentations of projects that were successful bids in the Presidential initiatives for 2023-2024 and the conference will close with the Presidential handover.

The Awards ceremony and Annual General Meeting will be held on Wednesday 3rd July and I am pleased offer my congratulations to both Ian Martin and Jeremy McMahon on their award of a Life Honorary Fellowship of BAOMS in recognition of their work on the QOMS project.

In addition, on Wednesday there will be a parallel day for our SAS colleagues and locally employed dentists with education specifically catering to their educational wishes including Kandasamy Ganesan teaching interpretation of CBCT, a review of TMI management by Andrew Sidebottom, Oral Medicine by Barbara Carey and what pathologists look for in oral biopsies by Ketan Shah, a pathology colleague in Oxford. Our IMPT colleagues will discuss surgical planning and the day will be rounded off by Partha Kar inspiring leadership. Please encourage your colleagues in your departments to attend, they do not need to be BAOMS members but will get a discounted early rate if they join, or can also attend as non-members too.

On Thursday 4th July there will be a parallel IMPT day with updates on GIRFT from Maire Morton and Edward Malton. Running with the patients' voice theme there will be input of patient experience of prosthetic rehabilitation followed by a 3D planning symposium including orthognathic surgery by Martin Dodd, and in head and neck reconstruction

by Richard Shaw and Taran Malhotra. Pauline Paul will discuss 3D planning in scaphocephaly and Peter Evans describing additive manufactured custom nasal obturators for VPI. In the afternoon there will be a session on advances in prosthetic rehabilitation, voice prostheses and patient specific orbital implants. Attendance for your IMPT colleagues is via the **BAOMS** members registration form, please let them know.

On Friday 5th July the Northwick Park team have organised a nurses day covering craniofacial trauma by Elizabeth Yeung, breaking bad news from Andrea Nelson and lacqueline Wallace, advances in head and neck surgery from Abdul Ahmed and Joss Harding covering mouth care. Lembit Opik will be their patient speaker and the morning will complete with a session on coaching by Bhavin Visavadia. The nurses will join the main room for the Norman Rowe lecture, Presidential initiatives and handover. Outpatient dental, medical, ward based and theatre nurses are all welcome and should use the link to book places at a highly subsidised rate. Please encourage attendance within your teams.

There will also be over 100 oral free paper speakers and some 150 ePosters with the top 30 on display onsite over the three days.

On Wednesday evening there will be a welcome reception at the Natural History Museum with live music, drinks and canapes. The annual dinner will be held on Thursday at Oxford Town Hall with a dress code of glamorous attire from your country of origin or black tie / DJs. There will be live music and an international disco, a chance to dress up and let your hair down.

There will be some early morning industry sponsored educational events but no sessions during lunchtimes to allow time to visit our sponsors and catch up with friends and see the local sights. My colleague Siddarth Gowrishankar is organising inclusive Oxford themed social events including a walking tour and punting I look forward to seeing friends and colleagues learning, networking and having fun.

CHAIR'S UPDATE

At the March 2024 Council meeting, we welcomed new members David Keith (Deputy Chair, becoming Chair January 2025), Montey Garg (Fellows elected member), Panayiotis Kyzas (BJOMS and ADOMS Editor), Amit Dattani (Deputy FiT Rep), Mairead Kelly (Deputy Members Representative and Chair of Junior Trainees Group). Council is working effectively together on your behalf leading guiding and delivering initiatives to benefit the wider membership.

Physician Associates (PAs): there has been much debate, angst and concerns across medicine as to the role of these healthcare professionals, and the impact on patient safety and surgical training. Council discussed the matter and we have now published the BAOMS position. The statement was led by our trainees with input by Trustees and Council members. It has had **a great response from colleagues on social media** and hopefully other specialties across medicine will follow and publish their own statements and positions.

European Union of Medical Specialties (UEMS): There has been concern by other surgical specialty associations about the membership value of this organisation which represents 43 specialties across the EU and its associated countries, working to set standards for high-quality healthcare practice. Some specialties have stopped their membership. The current President, Professor Vassilios Papalois attended March Council to give an overview of UEMS. Council agreed that BAOMS should continue membership of UEMS, which has several benefits, particularly to trainees. Please do have a look at the website: https://www.uems.eu

Federation of Surgical Specialty Associations (FSSA): We continue to work closely with FSSA and I attend regular meetings with the other specialties and the four Royal Colleges on our behalf. FSSA is keen to utilise the new BAOMS Code of Conduct which will be available later this year. A code of conduct outlining what is deemed unacceptable behaviour at the Annual Scientific Meeting in July forms part of the registration process on the BAOMS website. Many other specialties have published their own work for inappropriate behaviour including sexual misconduct. It is great that Carrie Newlands and her team have been so proactive in leading these initiatives.

Free OMFS book for Dental Students: following the success of the BAOMS-funded free to download book on OMFS for Medical Students, which has been promoted by the Medical Schools Council (MSC), a similar book is almost completed. Led by Nabeela Ahmed, with the same team as before, this should be available in time for the ASM in July. Hopefully the Dental Schools Council will also promote it widely to generate interest in the specialty. The link to the medical student book is available here.

Recruitment: OMFS continues to have issues with low applicant numbers for ST3 national selection. The Joint Committee on Surgical Training (JCST), Confederation of Postgraduate Schools of Surgery (COPSS), and GMC are aware. As Assessment Committee Chair for the AoMRC, I continue to work closely with the GMC, and hope they will be able to help us find solutions to this continuing concern with recruitment in our specialty and will keep you updated of any developments.

OOMS UPDATE APRIL 2024

QOMS PROGRESS

Twenty-three hospitals across England, Wales and Scotland are contributing to one or more QOMS registries. We have now captured more than 10,000 episodes of care across the whole project.

QOMS has successfully been added to the NHS England Quality Accounts for 2024-2025 by the Healthcare Quality Improvement Partnership (HQIP). Participation to QOMS is open to every OMFS department in the UK. We welcome engagement from all OMFS units, and the level of contribution can be tailored to the scope of each unit's practice.

NEW CONTENT IN QOMS

Since the end of 2023, we have added several new registries:

- *Salivary Gland Cancers registry (October 2023)
- *Rare and Benign Lesions of the Jaws registry (December 2023)

*Flexfacs masterclass launch webinars accessible through this link.

- **Patient-specific implants for mandible reconstruction in January 2024
- **Restorative dentistry / Oral rehabilitation for oncology patients, which we hope to pilot over the next few months with our Restorative dentists colleagues.

**These 2 registries are additions to the Oncology & Reconstruction audit and we have section 251 support from the HRA Confidential Advisory Group (CAG) to collect data without patient consent in England and Wales. Similar approval in under preparation for Scotland.

The BAOMS BOS Orthognathic PROM registry was rolled out nationally in January 2024


