More than 30 hospitals across the UK are contributing to the various QOMS registries. There are too many to name, but you can see them all on the map below.






Contributing hospitals to QOMS

QOMS PROJECTS

There is a lot going on so here is a summary of the current and upcoming projects:

CLOSING Oral and Dentoalveolar surgery (March 2025) LIVE Trauma Non-Melanoma Skin Cancers Oncology & Reconstruction Orthognathic Surgery NEW TMJ Arthroscopy (Dec 2024) TMJ Replacement (Dec 2024)









- The Oral and Dentoalveolar workstream (and its two audits) will close in March 2025 with no plans so far to continue data collection.
- A new TMJ workstream has gone live in December 2024. The TMJ SSIG Leads and Deputy Lead have developed two audits for TMJ Arthroscopy and TMJ Replacement.
- The other workstreams remain active:Trauma, Non-Melanoma Skin Cancers, Oncology & Reconstruction and Orthognathic Surgery.
- QOMS also includes a series of registries interested in the care of patients affected by rare conditions or undergoing less frequent procedures.
 - The Salivary Gland Cancers registry (consented).
 - The Rare and benign Lesions of the Jaws registry (consented).
 - The BAOMS BOS Orthognathic PROM registry in collaboration with BOS (consented).
 - The Restorative Dentistry / Oral Rehabilitation registry in collaboration with Restorative Dentist colleagues (consented).
 - The Patient-specific implant for mandible reconstruction registry.

The Salivary Gland Cancers and the Rare and benign Lesions of the Jaws registries are multidisciplinary and require inputs from other specialties, e.g. ENT and Oral Surgeons, Oncologists... We have been running online "roadshows" to engage with you and your colleagues from other specialties. If you are interested in contributing to those projects, let us know.

Dissemination

Using data remain a core value of the project and we encourage users to make the most if.

- 1. We have produced live dashboards for all the projects. These are customisable and we can create new ones to suit your own purposes. The dashboards allow to visualise your hospital's data in a practical way (e.g. downloadable figures) and compare your results to the overall cohort. Admittedly, the REDCap interface for dashboards is bit clunky and we are exploring alternatives to enhance your experience.
- 2. Data request can be submitted to the Team to access larger datasets.
- **3.** We are working hard to produce the QOMS second report and hope to publish it in the Spring 2025.
- **4.** QOMS will have a 30-min session at BAOMS2025 on Friday June 20, 2025 from 9:00 to 9:30 to discuss "Outliers in QOMS". Please join us and all welcome.
